

- 4. Comments regarding course





Thank you for the learning, the patience, and the laughs. Best of luck in your next step. :)

Asked questions to try to ascertain if the students understood the material or if they just memorized examples from class. Took time outside of class to provide additional instruction, because the material was too substantial and challenging for almost all of the students to make it through in the designated class period. he was very open and available for one—on—one instruction.

He is helpful and provides feedback on assessments. He is always ready to help and added extra time to accommodate sessions for office hours.

The professor provide us extra sessions for us to learn. He is respectful towards me and other classmates and took the time to help us understand the material. The graphs he drew in classroom helps a lot.

He will devote extra office hours to help the students learn about challenging concepts. The way the course is structured is also great, starting from the basic concepts of economics, into some more detailed concepts, and the application of the concepts.

He offered review session for the assignments that due from the previous weeks which is very helpful for me and the class in general. He didn't mind to reexplain the subject matters once i feel unclear about it.

Hosam did a really great job of breaking down each class topic and going it over again and again until we understood. He was very patient. He was always available during office hours or finding another time when those hours did not work.

What suggestions do you have for improving the course?

Comments

Only one student had any economic background, so the subject matter was challenging for most, especially while working to familiarize with the economic references and their meanings. Therefore, many students were still trying to grasp the basic concepts when they were being asked to think critically and apply nuances. I observed that it seemed some students got really confused when "devil's advocate" or socratic method were applied, because some people had trouble differentiating between content that was being taught vs. challenges that were posed to get them to challenge based on understanding of the material.

More class time and sessions with people with low understanding of economics and its principles

A suggestion would be continue to do what you are doing with drawing graphs and helping out students. I do like how you encourage us to work with our classmates in homework.

Student presentations should be calculated as part of a significant part of the grade since we put a lot of efforts for the presentation, equal to or if not more than the weekly problem sets

Give at least 20 more minutes for each since there is a lot to cover on this class.

Personally, nothing to improve. His teaching style was great and he was very knowledgable on the subject.
